Spelling

- New spellings are issued to the children each Tuesday. These will be written into your child's planner.
- We follow the Spelling Zoo scheme of work which follows the requirements of the National Curriculum.
- There is a list of spellings which children are expected to be able to spell correctly by the end of Upper Key Stage 2. They are all incorporated into the weekly spellings and are revisited throughout the year.
- Your child will practise spellings at school but they also need to practise them at home. They will be tested each Tuesday and the children will know their scores.



Maths Medals

- Each week your child will complete a timed, times table challenge, building from where they were in year 5. These will include both multiplication and division.
- A copy of your child's sheet will be sent home each week for your child to practise. Please support your child in learning their tables as we cannot emphasise how important they are.
- Furthermore, your child will love receiving their certificate in Celebration Assembly.

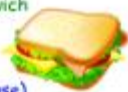

SATs

- Key Stage 2 SATs take place nationally in the week commencing 14th May 2018.
- Statutory tests will be administered in the following subjects:
 - Reading (60 minutes)
 - Spelling (approximately 15 minutes)
 - Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (45 minutes)
 - Mathematics:
 - Paper 1: Arithmetic (30 minutes)
 - Paper 2: Reasoning (40 minutes)
 - Paper 3: Reasoning (40 minutes)
 - Writing is teacher assessed



Reporting of Key Stage 2 Results

- As part of your child's end of year report, they will receive a teacher assessment and test result for Reading and Maths, a test result only for Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling and a teacher assessment only for Writing.
- The results are no longer reported as levels.
- Pupils raw scores are converted into a scaled score. In order to be working at the expected standard for year 6, children will need to achieve a scaled score of 100 or above.
- Children will be assessed as working towards or working at the expected standard.
- In writing, children can achieve greater depth.
