Each week, at 3 o'clock, two JTAs will go onto the playground and choose one bike or scooter, from either KS1 or KS2 to attach the golden lock onto. The winners will receive 20 team points and a certificate.</p> <p>JTAs - thoughts: Will the laminated lock fly away? - We will need to make sure we attach it to the bike. We will need to knot it/loop it etc. What happens if a JTA bike/scooter is chosen? - JTAs cannot choose their own bike/scooter if they are the JTAs on duty that week.
