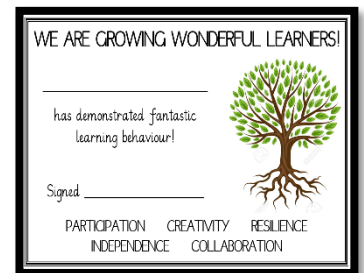

They also provided us with compost, and gardening equipment so that we can start a growing campaign within the school. We have been growing fungi in part of a national competition led by Kew gardens. Mr Bains have continued to support our 'litter pickers' and the children continue to take sole responsibility for recycling the paper and plastic used within school. Mr Keeley has been very helpful in starting to sort out the flower containers around school and our allotment area. Children have planted and watered a variety of vegetables which are currently growing nicely. We were very grateful for the donations of spare pots and compost from the FOB.
