Dear Parents/Carers,

COVID-19 Single Positive Case - Year 2 Closure Notice

This afternoon we have been notified that there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 within Benhurst Primary School. We know you may find this concerning but we are continuing to monitor the situation and have informed the appropriate authorities. This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child.

The positive case is within the Year 2 bubble; the children and staff in Year 2 who have been in direct prolonged contact with the pupil confirmed to have tested positive for COVID-19 will need to self-isolate for 10 days. **This means our Year 2 bubble must isolate up to and including Friday 19th March. This is 10 days after the Year 2 children and staff were in close contact with the pupil who has tested positive. The children can return to school on Monday 22nd March.**

The children in the Year 2 bubble should be collected as soon as possible via the school office.

When self-isolating, it is essential that the children and staff do not leave the house unless for an emergency. Household members do not need to self-isolate as they themselves have not been in direct contact with the positive case.

Benhurst Primary School remains open for all other children. The Year 2 bubble will be provided with remote learning from Monday 15th March via Google Classroom for the duration of their isolation. Please see your child's Google Classroom for further information.

Can siblings still attend school?

Pupils in all other year groups, including the siblings of pupils who are isolating, should continue to attend school. We understand it may be a challenge for some parents to make the necessary arrangements to look after one child who is self-isolating whilst getting another child to school. Where it is not possible to safely bring siblings into school, we understand some children may be absent from school. Learning will be added to Google Classroom to support these children.

Displaying COVID-19 symptoms or a positive test result

If your child displays symptoms or is tested positive for COVID-19, please email the school office and myself immediately and include a contact mobile number.

If your child receives a positive COVID test result outside of our school office hours (8.30am - 4.00pm Monday to Friday during term time), please report this via text message to the following number: 07729086539 stating your child's name and class, the date they were last in school, the date they became symptomatic, the date they were tested. This will enable us to respond to any cases outside of school hours in a timely manner. We will confirm we have received your message. Please do not use this number for any other purpose than reporting a positive Benhurst pupil case

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19. Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often - do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available

- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
